


## Refugees worldwide: Student worksheet

There were 10.3 million refugees in total. Estimate the number in each region.




#### Where do refugees come from? Where do refugees go?

Major refugee-hosting countries | end-2011


The bar graphs show source countries and hosting countries.

\*\*\* UNHCR estimate.




Major source countries of refugees | end-2011
