Creative ways of working with Indigenous learners

A number of studies point to a relationship between memory and involving different parts of the brain in the learning process. Damian will examine some of these studies, identify some of the sticking points between the data and suggest what the findings could mean for us as teachers of mathematics. Damian will then look at the Indigenous experience historically with regard to the way people were taught and how facts were retained. Drawing on some real life examples, Damian will then suggest some methods that Indigenous students could be engaged in mathematics education. The session will be an open forum and encourage interaction and the sharing of experiences and ideas from all participating.
